## A MESSAGE FROM YOUR CITY MANAGER

Dear Neighbor,

As Westminster plans for the future of our City, we wanted to update you on the needs of our City.

As you may be aware, due to millions of dollars in State takeaways, Westminster has been grappling with significant budget shortfalls over the past five years. In order to offset these takeaways, the City has been forced to utilize our emergency reserves and deeply cut vital local services.

Even with significant budget cuts, the City has a \$3.7 million dollar budget deficit that is expected to double by Fiscal Year 2017-18. With our reserves nearly depleted, and in order to avoid bankruptcy, we will be forced to make further cuts to vital city services. Additional service reductions could include the elimination of specialized police units and potentially shutting down Westminster's local police department.

However, even after enacting over \$4.3 million in budget cuts, the City is still left with a \$12 million structural budget deficit. The City Council has placed a six-year, one cent Transaction and Use tax on the ballot for voter consideration. If enacted by voters, this measure would allow the City to maintain, and not significantly reduce services that residents have indicated are important.

Additionally, the City Council, at the advice of the Citizens Financial Task Force, has directed staff to engage the community regarding Westminster's fiscal situation. # WESTMINSTER FINANCIAL PRIORITIES AND SERVICE NEEDS

## Frequently Asked Questions

**Q: What is the issue?**

**A:** Because of years of State takeaways of millions of local tax dollars, the City of Westminster is facing a \$3.7 Million dollar budget deficit this year that is expected to double by Fiscal Year 2017-18, with an estimated \$12 million dollar structural budget deficit overall. Reserves will be depleted soon and without drastic changes, the City will soon be unable to present a balanced budget as required by state law.

**Q: Does the City's current fiscal crisis affect public safety?**

**A:** Yes. 77.5% of Westminster's budget is dedicated to public safety. In just the last year, the Westminster Police Department processed more than 135,000 calls, including 37,000 emergency 911 calls. Medical experts agree that after five minutes the brain starts to deteriorate following a serious trauma, like a heart attack. Additional local funds would help ensure that Firefighters and Paramedics have the resources they need to quickly respond to emergencies and save lives.

Additionally, there are over 100 active gang members in Westminster. To keep our community safe, we must prevent devastating cuts to gang and drug prevention programs and continue after school programs that keep children and youth off the streets and away from gangs and drugs.

**Q: How can we support our local businesses in this difficult time?**

**A:** We need to do more to stimulate economic growth and create more good-paying local jobs in Westminster. Doing so will protect local property values and help Westminster remain attractive to businesses, visitors and homebuyers by maintaining public safety services, fixing blight and improving programs to fill vacant storefronts with new businesses.

**Q: What priorities for Westminster has the community identified to date?**

**A:** Top service priorities that we've heard so far include:

- Protecting local drinking water supplies
- Providing fast emergency response times
- Fighting gangs and drugs
- Preventing the elimination of Police Narcotics, Domestic Violence, Sex Crimes, and Human Trafficking units
- Preventing cuts to 911 response, and the number of Paramedics and Firefighters
- Preserving Westminster's local Police Department
- Recruiting and retaining Vietnamese /Spanish speaking Police Officers and improving communications and outreach to those communities
- Preventing City bankruptcy
- Repairing streets and potholes
- Promoting programs that attract businesses and create jobs

**Q: Have residents been engaged? How is the City responding to this crisis?**

**A:** Yes. To date the City has enacted \$4.3 million dollars in cuts. Additionally, in late 2015, the City empanelled a Citizens Financial Task Force to study the issue and present recommendations to the City Council. One of their recommendations, which was unanimously accepted, directs the City to engage the community regarding Westminster's fiscal issues.

Finally, due to the size of Westminster's structural deficit, and a desire by the City Council to preserve services that residents have indicated are important, in particular public safety, the City Council has placed a one cent Transaction and Use revenue measure on the November 2016 ballot for voter consideration. If enacted by voters, this measure would provide locally-controlled funds for six years.



You've done a great job conserving, now make your conservation a permanent habit. Keep turning off the faucet while you wash dishes, reducing the amount of time you water your lawn and taking shorter showers.

### Outdoor Savings Add Up

Focusing on outdoor irrigation is a great way to find water savings. Homeowners use up to 70% of their water outdoors and up to 50% of that water is wasted! Follow the US EPA's tips on efficient outdoor water use.



**Spruce Up Your Sprinkler System** 

**Inspect** sprinkler heads. A broken one can waste **25,000** gallons of water in six months!

And don't forget: the State made some restrictions permanent for California. Make sure you're in compliance:

1. No excess runoff outdoors (water flowing onto walkways, non-irrigated areas, streets etc.)
2. Hoses must be fitted with a positive shut-off nozzle while washing cars
3. No washing down driveways or sidewalks
4. No watering outdoor landscapes during and within 48 hours after measurable rainfall

The 24 hour CERT course covers topics such as Introduction to Disaster Preparedness, First Aid, Light Search and Rescue, Fire Suppression, and Disaster Psychology. Classes are held in the Spring and the Fall.

*Be prepared for the unexpected. Take steps now to protect your family and your home before the next earthquake, wildfire, or other disaster strikes.*

### **Make a Family Disaster Plan**

Discuss how to prepare for and respond to a disaster. Plan to share responsibilities and work together as a team.

- Consider special needs for elderly or disabled family members, children, and pets.
- Choose meeting places outside your home and outside your neighborhood. Discuss what to do in an evacuation, and plan multiple routes in case of road closures.
- Choose an out-of-state contact person who can relay information to and from everyone in your household.
- Register for AlertOC, Orange County's emergency notification system, to receive information during and after an emergency.
- Enroll in CPR and first aid classes so you can take care of yourself and your family while you wait for first responders to arrive.

### **Create Emergency Supply Kits**

Your emergency supply kits should have enough supplies to last you and your family for at least three days.

- Make sure your family kit is portable in case you need to evacuate.
- Consider individual and family needs.
- Include supplies for your pets.
- Create smaller, portable kits for your car and workplace.

### **Prepare Your Home**

Identify and find solutions for any hazards in your home.

- Bolt or brace water heaters, major appliances, bookcases, and other top-heavy furniture to wall studs.
- Anchor or brace overhead fixtures such as lights and ceiling fans.
- Use flexible connections where gas lines meet appliances.
- Secure televisions, computers, and other electronics.
- Secure or relocate heavy pictures or mirrors over beds and furniture.
- Know where and how to shut off gas, water, and electricity.

## What goes Where

### Blue container – Recyclables

Plastics, styrofoam, phonebooks, newspaper, magazines, hard-back and soft-back books, junk mail, milk cartons, cardboard boxes and most other dry paper products, tin and aluminum, glass jars and bottles.

### Black container – Non Recyclables

Household trash items such as animal waste, food waste, grease in sealed containers, coffee grounds, old clothes, shoes and yard waste (grass and tree trimmings).

### What not to place into containers

Please do not put scrap-metal, wood, appliances, rocks, dirt, concrete, bricks, tile, carpeting, appliances, furniture, household hazardous waste, trees, large shrubs, large palms leaves, cactus and needles in your refuse and recycle containers. These types of items will damage the truck's packing mechanism and will also damage your containers. Containers that are too heavy will break the automatic arms.

### Household Hazardous Waste

The County operates four Household Hazardous Waste Collection Centers for Orange County residents to dispose of hazardous materials. These collection centers accept used motor oil, paint, solvents, pesticides, used automotive batteries, household cleaning products, and pool chemicals. Products must be packaged in their original containers.

Visitors dropping off hazardous waste are required to provide proof of Orange County residency. Centers are open Tuesday through Saturday, from 9:00 a.m. to 3:00 p.m., and closed on rainy days. Collection centers do not accept any form ammunition or asbestos products.

## WESTMINSTER SCHOOL DISTRICT

Westminster School District offers both Spanish Dual Language Immersion and Vietnamese Dual Language Immersion for the 2016-2017 school year. Spanish Dual Language Immersion will be offered for preschool, one class for three year olds and one class for four year olds, and kindergarten (two classes with 24 students in each class). Preschool will be three hours a day, five days a week. Kindergarten is full day, five days a week. Vietnamese Dual Language Immersion is offered in kindergarten and first grade. We have a waiting list for kindergarten classes and five spots in first grade. If you would like your child to be a part of the Spanish Dual Language Immersion or Vietnamese Dual Language Immersion program, register soon! This program is open to all preschool, kindergarten, and first grade students in Southern California. Before and after school day care is available on site.

Why choose dual language immersion? Dual language immersion integrates native English speaking and English language learning students in the same classroom and provides academic instruction through two languages, one of which is the primary language of each group (for example Vietnamese and English or Spanish and English). The students, in the Dual Language Immersion program, will be engaged 50% of the day in English and 50% of the day in the target language. The goals and research based benefits of dual language immersion are bilingualism, biliteracy, cultural proficiency, global citizenship, at or above grade level achievement, 21<sup>st</sup> century skills, increased family involvement and the Westminster School District Pathways to Biliteracy awards attainment in kindergarten, third, fifth, and eighth grades.


